On September 13th, our 6^{th} , 7^{th} , and 8^{th} graders, along with about 2,000 other SFUSD students, had the opportunity to watch the documentary film, "Bully," as a part of the Bay Area Stop Bullying Summit.

The movie dealt with serious topics including cruel and violent bullying, homophobia and anti-gay slurs, and "bully-cide." Our students were responsible and respectful audience members at the Metreon, and many expressed feeling moved by the film and inspired to take a stand against cruelty and mistreatment.

All of our 6^{th} and $7^{th}/8^{th}$ grade teachers were present to support our students as they watched the movie, and our Language Arts teachers, Ms. Vernace and Ms. Contreras, taught lessons before and after the film to help students prepare for and process the emotionally difficult content of the movie. "I" Statements

"I" statements allow a person to share how they are feeling without criticizing or blaming. Here are some ideas and discussion questions for helping your child practice this skill at home:

K-1st: At different times of the day and during different activities, encourage your child to reflect on and express their feelings using an "I" statement.

2nd-3rd: Challenge your child to identify a wide range of feelings using "I" statements. How many feeling words can he or she come up with?

4th-5th: Discuss how these two statements feel different to the listener: *1. When you interrupt me while I'm speaking, I feel frustrated. 2. You never let me finish!* What other examples can your child come up with?

6th-8th: Take turns asking and answering these questions with your child: When is it easy to use an "I" statement? When is it hard? How do you remember to use an "I" statement?
