

## Dress Code

Rooftop has chosen to have a "no uniform" policy. As a school community we have agreed to allow students to take responsibility for dressing in a manner that is not disruptive to learning. Clothing and accessories should not be distracting, nor make inappropriate statements.

### **To guide student choices, Rooftop has a school-wide dress code that we expect each student to follow.**

1. All tops must cover the upper shoulders and not hang loose under the arms. As a guideline, tops must be also long enough to be able to tucked-in when students' hands are raised. No spaghetti straps, strapless or low cut tops. Tank Tops must have a 3 finger width on the strap. Boy's tee shirts should not be oversized and fall below the hips.
2. Pants must be worn in an appropriate manner. Pants must fit the student. Sagging is not permitted. Shorts and skirts must be at fingertip length.
3. Cut offs, and writing on clothing is prohibited. Ragged/shredded jeans or jeans with holes are prohibited unless leggings are worn underneath.
4. Ethnic and gender slurs, suggestive statements, hate messages, "snitch wear", slogans endorsing alcohol or drugs are strictly prohibited.
5. Wearing, carrying or displaying slogans (including tags on back packs, belt buckles and shoes), initials, roman numerals, colors or attire that advocates gang participation or affiliation is prohibited.
6. No pajamas allowed. Underwear should never be visible.
7. Students must wear shoes appropriate for successful PE participation. Flip Flops, backless shoes and heels are not allowed.
8. Students are not allowed to wear hats or head-coverings on the school grounds. (Lunchtime included)

### **Cell Phones, CD Players and iPods**

Parents, we have a huge problem with cell phone rule compliance.

**Please do not allow your student to bring a cell phone to school unless it is an absolute family communication necessity.**

In accordance with SFUSD policy students may not have cell phones on, or visible during the school day. Cell phones need to be kept locked in students' lockers. Rooftop is not responsible for lost, damaged or stolen cell phones. If a student's cell phone is visible, and/or a student is using their cell phone during the school day, a detention slip will be written and the cell phone will be confiscated and sent to the office. Rooftop is not responsible for any damage or loss when cell phones have been confiscated. Students who receive a cell phone detention, will be required to check their phone in and out of the office daily. If your student receives more than one cell phone detention a parent conference will be required and may result in termination of cell phone rights.

iPods, MPR players, CD Players and any type of digital toy are not allowed and will be confiscated. They will only be returned to the student's parent. Rooftop is not responsible for any damage or loss of these items if a students brings any of these items on campus.
